

SUFFRAGISTS PLAN CELEBRATION HERE

Women Voters to Discuss
Results of Victory

Miss Alice Stone Blackwell Will Be
Given an Ovation

A special meeting of the Massachusetts Woman Suffrage Association will be held at the New England Women's Club, 585 Boylston st, Friday morning, July 25. This is the first meeting of the association since the Legislature ratified the Federal Suffrage amendment, and it is expected that important issues will be presented. There will be also an informal celebration of the victory. Mrs Charles Sumner Bird, first vice president, will preside.

At the morning session Mrs Frank J. Shuler, corresponding secretary of the National Woman Suffrage Association, will give an address on "The Responsibilities Victory Brings to Suffrage Organizations." The report of the department of education for citizenship will be given by Mrs True Worthy White, executive secretary of that department.

At noon there will be a Victory luncheon at headquarters. During the afternoon the association will keep "open house" for all who wish to participate in the Victory celebration and greet Miss Alice Stone Blackwell, president of the association, who has devoted her life to the cause of woman suffrage—a movement in which her mother and fathers were pioneers.
