



A surprising number of nationally known suffragists spent summers in Scituate. One even lived in the keeper's cottage of Scituate Light after it had been abandoned by the US government. Join us as we explore their fascinating stories. We will review their roles in the fight for the vote for women, which culminated in the adoption of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution 100 years ago.

Lyle Nyberg has documented the history and architectural features of more than 50 historic buildings in Scituate, and even Boston, working with the Scituate Historical Commission. He has given talks on the Rivermoor summer colony, seaside summers in Scituate, the story of Third Cliff, and grand old homes of Scituate (available on YouTube). Lyle is a member of the Scituate Historical Society and the Massachusetts Historical Society. He is writing a history of Third Cliff and seacoast Scituate. He also just published a book about Scituate's summer suffragists.
